VfC Change Counsellors Reflection

A reflection hosted for the community based counsellors on the 26th of April 2018, at the VfC Resource Centre. The meeting was scheduled to give space for counselors to come together and share their data and experiences and to receive updates in preparation for group counselling sessions.

Family Team training reflection

On the 13th of June 2018 VfC conducted Family Team trainings final reflection under the ACIAR project. The project ended in May this year 2018.

A total of 33 participants attended the reflection meeting to share their life changing stories from the training. Some of them presented their written success stories while others chose to verbally present their stories.

Peace Building training reflection

n this guarter VfC conducted four reflections with participants on Peace Building and Social Mapping training under the Women Human Rights Defenders desk. This activity was funded by IWDA.

A total of 65 participants comprising of 21 females and 44 males received the peace building and social mapping training. Participants presented their success stories and their personal commitments that they made after the training. The participants were from Eka, Manda, Warakar and Malbanga.

Mentorship Training

On the 28th of May to 1^{st} of June 2018, VfC facilitated

a Mentorship training for 31 potential women leaders to become Mentors for the Young girls in Jiwaka who are currently under the pilot Young Women Leadership and Mentoring program. On the last day of training 16 young girls were paired with mentors. The training was delivered by Ms Barbara Tanne, former Executive Director for Bougainville Women Federation with support from IWDA under its WAVE Program. WAVE is funded by the government of the Netherlands.



Gender Base Violence and Human Rights training

Over the month of June trainings on Ending Gender Base Violence and Human Rights were facilitated by VfC and delivered by Ms Lucy Berak:

- 4th 8th of June 2018 for Eka Community
- 11th 15th of June 2018 for Kinska Community
- 18th 22nd of June 2018 for Manda Community
- 25th 29th of June 2018 for Kilip Community.

A total of 95 participants including 45 women and 50 men received the training across the four communities. The participants expressed their understanding, appreciation and developed an action plan, making personal

Active Citizen Training

On the 21st to 25th of May 2018, a week long training on Active Citizenship was facilitated by Ms Lilly BeSoer and Ms Sina Joe.

A total of 26 participants including 9 men and 17 women received the training. The training was to empower people to engage peacefully and effectively with others in the sustainable development of the communities
